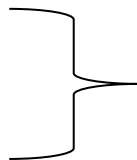
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# Achieving the Promise

# How it Works

- Step 1 – Sign Up (*by Dec 15<sup>th</sup> of freshmen year*)

- Step 3 – Graduate on Time College Ready (no remedial courses post-high school)
- Step 4 – Enroll at Harper
- Step 5 – Monitor criteria while attending Harper

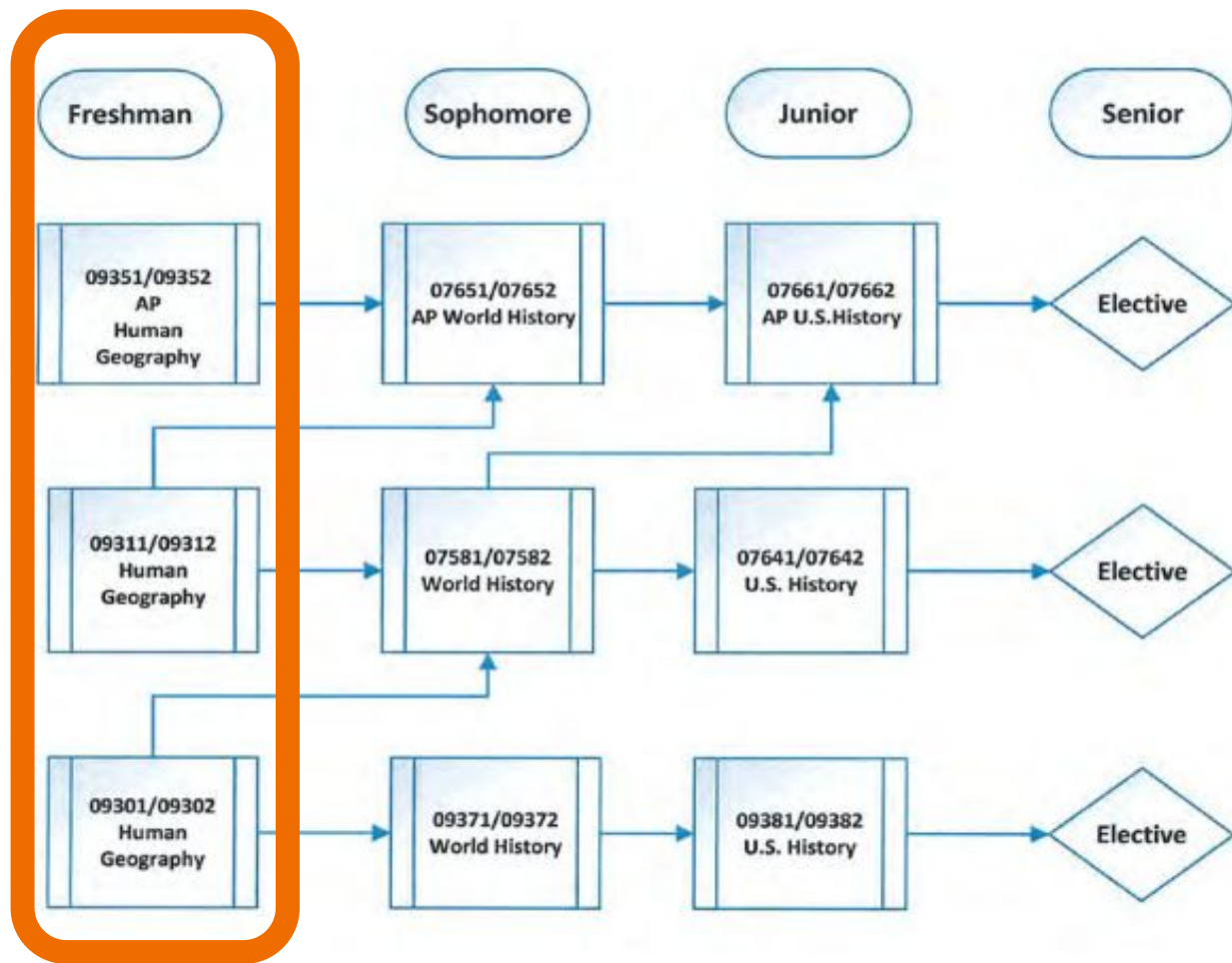

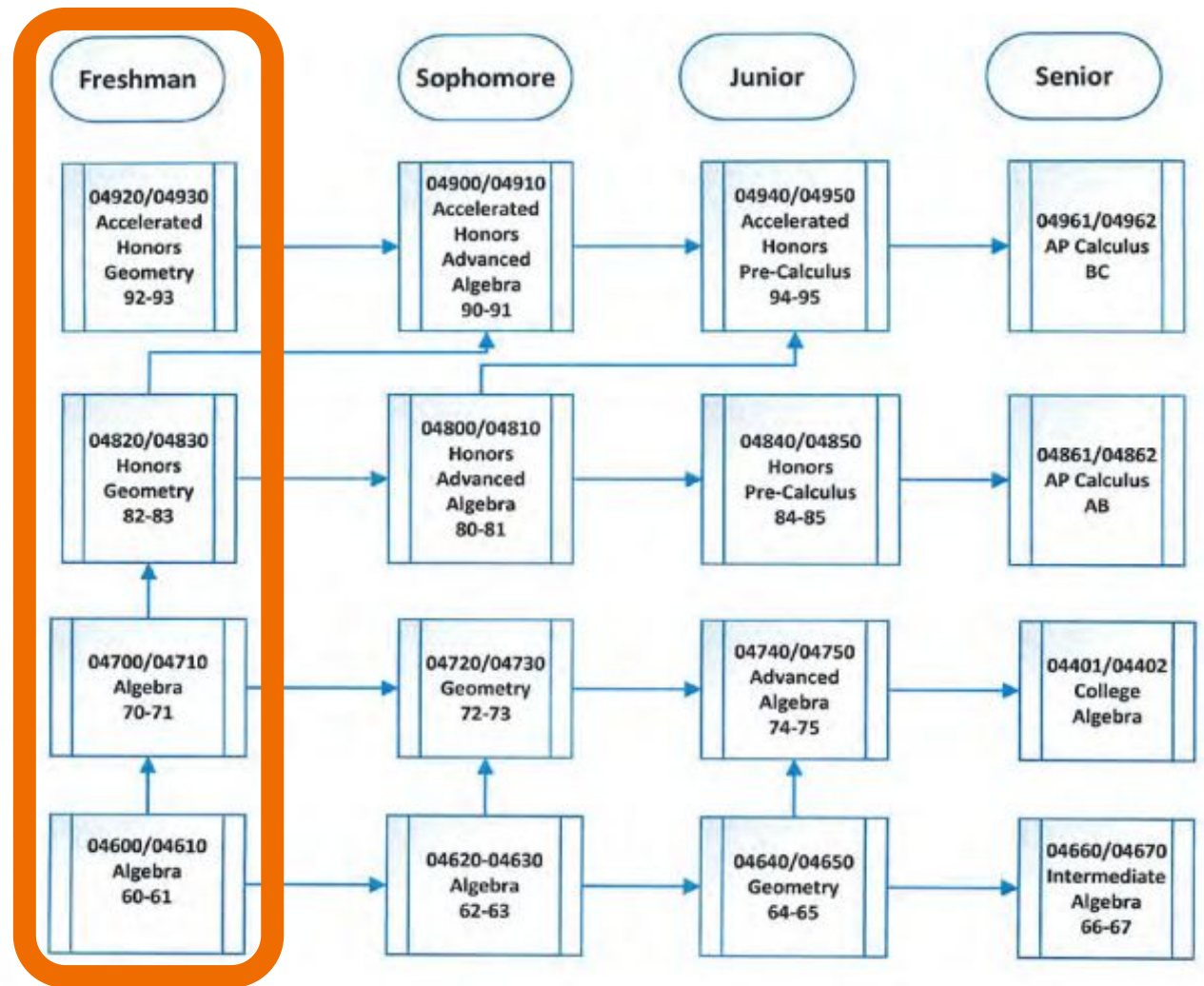

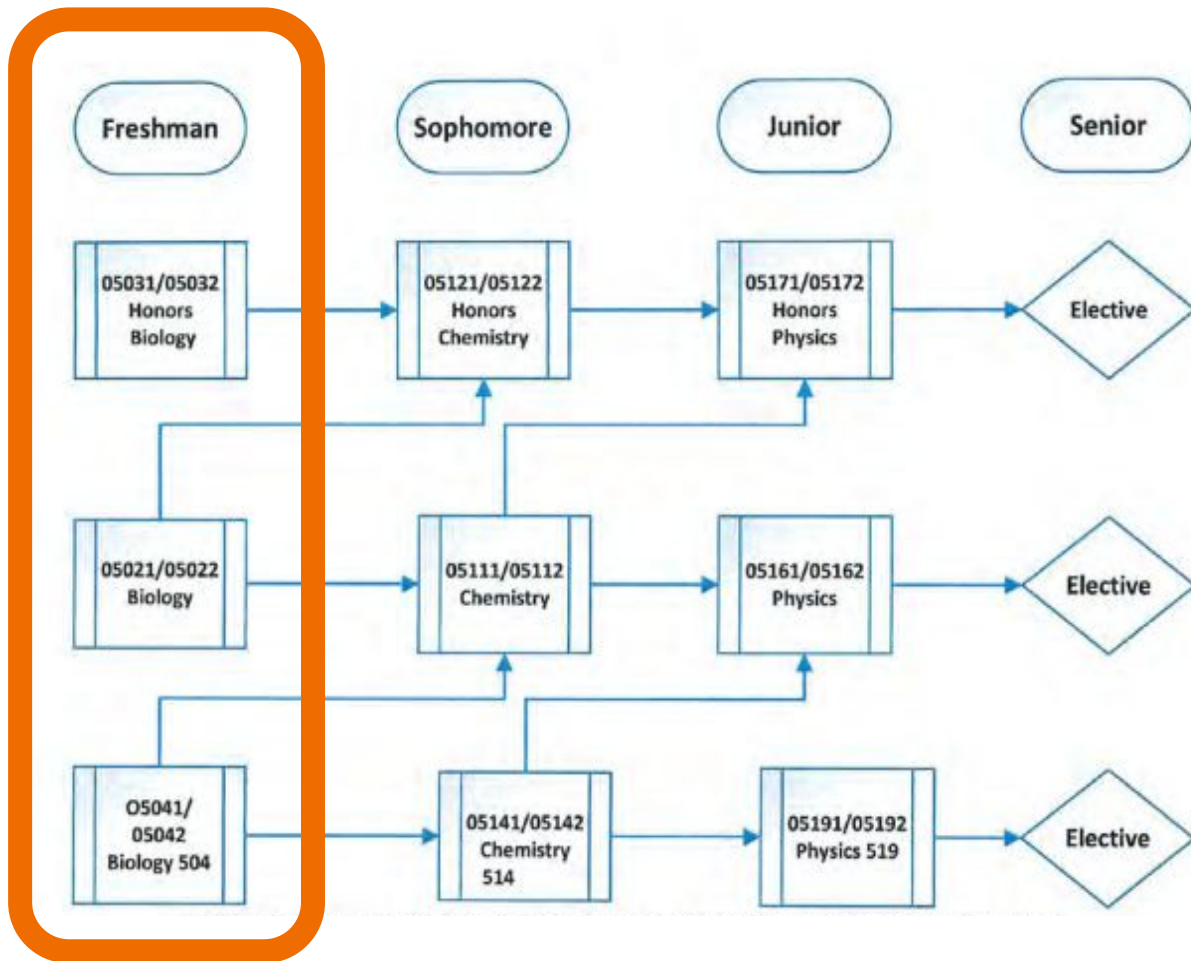
